

Profiles of Reading Difficulty: Implications for Speech Language Pathologists

Speaker: Richard P. Zipoli, Ph.D., CCC-SLP

Course Description: This intermediate level presentation will describe several developmental profiles of reading disability. A central premise is that students will benefit when speech-language pathologists and other members of educational teams are trained to systematically integrate and collaboratively appraise multiple sources of assessment information (regardless of which professionals administer specific measures of reading, language, and cognition). Topics will include a framework for diagnosis of reading disabilities, the role of particular measures of phonological processing and phonics in identifying patterns of difficulty, and links between reading and cognitive-linguistic performance.

Learner Outcomes:

After attending this presentation, learner will be able to:

1. Describe four profiles of reading disability.
2. Explain the unique contributions of three different measures of phonological processing and four distinct measures of word reading ability.
3. Describe four speech or language impairments that can compromise the validity of measures of oral reading fluency and identify and alternate assessment procedure.

Richard P. Zipoli, Ph.D., CCC-SLP is an associate professor and clinical instructor in the Department of Communication Disorders at Southern Connecticut State University. He received a Ph.D. in the Department of Educational Psychology at the University of Connecticut, with a program of study in special education emphasizing learning and reading disabilities. His current interests include childhood and adolescent language disorders, learning disabilities, and reading difficulties, as well as service delivery in high-need schools.

Getting your hands on IDDSI: Applying methods to current practice

Speaker: Katlyn Baker M.S., CCC-SLP

Course Description: This presentation will assist clinicians in understanding of the International Dysphagia Diet Standardization Initiation. Learners will become familiar with IDDSI framework, definitions and support for successful implementation within their respective facilities. This presentation will review IDDSI framework and standardization for testing methods. An interactive food lab will allow hands on experience for clinicians to become familiar with the standardized process for testing food and liquids. Clinicians will walk away with handouts needed to facilitate a successful role out program as well as the support needed for the upcoming elimination of the National Dysphagia Diet.

Directions:

FROM HARTFORD AND NEW HAVEN – I-91 Take exit 13 and follow to the end. Take left to light. Take right onto Toelles Road, over railroad tracks and follow to end. Take right onto Hartford Tpke and go past the Oakdale Theater then take next left, Cook Hill Road. Follow up hill and take 7th right, which is Schoolhouse Road and continue to first stop sign then take a left onto Cheshire Road. The Club is less than a mile on the right side.

FROM HARTFORD #91 TO #15 (GOING SOUTH) Once on #15 take exit #64 and follow to the end (stop light). Take left, stay in right lane. Take right at next stop light onto Cheshire Road and follow to first stop sign. Take left to next stop sign then take right, which is a continuation of Cheshire Road. Club is less than a mile on the right side.

FROM WATERBURY – I-84 Take Cheshire exit #26 and follow Rt. 70 to the end. Take right onto Route #10. Follow Route #10 to McDonalds, on left side, then take next left, which is Jinny Hill Road and follow to the end. Take a right onto Coleman Road and at the next stop sign bear left. Follow road and the Club will be on the left hand side.

FROM CHESHIRE #10 (FROM HAMDEN) Take right at light onto Cook Hill Road. Follow to first stop sign. Take left onto Tuttle Avenue and go to the end. Take right and Club is on the left side.

FROM NEW HAVEN – #15 Take exit #64 and follow to the end (stop light). Take left, go the second light and take right onto Cheshire Road. Follow to first stop sign. Take a left to next stop sign then take a right, which is continuation of Cheshire Road. The Club is less than a mile on the right side.
